



Greetings from Samborondon, Ecuador where God is fast at work with His servants bringing in His harvest. We recently received an email update from Pastor Jose with some very encouraging news. In the month of January, through a teen outreach event at the church, 25 Ecuadorian youth committed their lives to Christ! Praise the Lord!

In this update Pastor Jose was also excited to let us know that they had begun work on the expansion of the church/school in Samborondon with the funds that the church and the school have raised. They have saved \$12,000 to do this work and the project is moving quickly. However, they are going to need to bring in an additional \$5,000 to complete the project.

We are sending out this letter to humbly ask if you would consider assisting in this project. Pastor Jose and his wife have done a tremendous job in leading this project to this point. They are faithful servants of this calling that the Lord has given them and we would like to see them finish the project before the beginning of the new school year. This will add 4 new classrooms to the existing school where there are currently 200 children enrolled. These new classrooms will enable 100 more students to attend; mostly from un-churched families, and receive a Christ-based education changing their lives forever. Please prayerfully consider helping to get this project done!
